Rudy is the current leader of the firm's Litigation Practice Group. His practice focuses on representing corporations and individuals in complex business disputes at both the trial and appellate levels.

Appeals

Rudy is one of Colorado's more experienced appellate lawyers. He has argued multiple appeals in state and federal courts, including cases before the Colorado Court of Appeals, Colorado Supreme Court, the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals, and the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. Most recently, Rudy served as lead appellate counsel and presented oral argument before the Colorado Supreme Court in *Ralph L. Wadsworth Construction Company, LLC v. Regional Rail Partners*, 2026 CO 19, a [unanimous decision](#) reversing the Court of Appeals and resolving two significant questions under Colorado's Public Works Act with statewide implications for contractors and subcontractors. In recent years, he also successfully defended an eight-figure damage award to a large public works contractor, convinced the Colorado Court of Appeals to affirm a preliminary injunction in a high-dollar trade secrets misappropriation case, and obtained a reversal of a significant personal injury judgment in a case involving an issue of first impression under Colorado law. Prior to entering private practice, Rudy clerked for The Honorable Timothy Tymkovich of the Tenth Circuit and the Honorable Sandra Rothenberg of the Colorado Court of Appeals. He is admitted to practice in the United States Supreme Court.

Commercial Litigation

Rudy has extensive experience in cases involving business torts, corporate governance and fiduciary disputes, employment, consumer protection, construction, and insurance coverage. As national litigation counsel for a Colorado technology company, Rudy has defended consumer protection cases across the country and represented the client before a U.S. Senate Committee. Rudy also regularly represents companies in privacy and data security litigation, including cases involving data breaches and violations of state and federal privacy laws. In a pro bono capacity, Rudy represented Marshall Fire victims in opposing challenges to Boulder County's clean-up efforts after the most destructive wildfire in Colorado history.

Insurance

Rudy represents clients seeking to enforce coverage or recover policy proceeds under general liability, directors and officers, first-party property, business interruption, environmental site liability, cyber liability, and other specialty insurance policies. He also assists clients in conducting insurance audits and obtaining specialty insurance coverage for businesses with unique risk profiles.
